Victory Lectures October 23-27, 2022

The 28th annual Victory Lectures are slated to be held at the West Virginia School of Preaching/Hillview Terrace church of Christ October 23-27. We invite all to attend.

For some time, we have been alternating between textual studies in the Old Testament one year, and in the New Testament the next. Then, since 2015, this has particularized a little more. We have been covering the Psalms in odd-numbered years, and now have four volumes (2015, 2017, 2019, 2021). Lord willing, our fifth volume will be in 2023 and we will have completely covered all 150 Psalms. This year, though, it is the turn for a textual study in the New Testament. The lectureship committee has chosen the books of *1 & 2 Timothy and Titus*.

These letters were, of course, written by Paul to young preachers, Timothy and Titus, both of whom Paul regarded as sons in the faith (1 Tim. 1:2; Titus 1:4). In these three short personal epistles is much information and instruction applicable not only to preachers but to all Christians. We hope you will join us for this study. Our speakers include Allen Webster and Wade Webster.

Patrick “Scott” McKeever

1964-2022

September 4, 2022, Patrick “Scott” McKeever, passed from this life in a motorcycle accident, at the age of fifty-eight.

Scott was a member of the year 2000 graduating class from the West Virginia School of Preaching. He had grown up in the Ohio Valley area, graduating from Wheeling Park High School in 1982. He married Amy Harris of the Hillview Terrace congregation in 1985. Together, they were blessed with two children, Ty (Madison) and Kailah. Scott and Amy have three grandchildren, Timia Perry, Molly McKeever, and Harrison McKeever.

After receiving a degree in criminal justice from West Liberty State University, Scott worked as a city policeman in Florida for several years. While in Florida, he had been using his days off to attend classes at the Florida School of Preaching. Upon retiring from police-work, Scott desired to go to school. He and his wife Amy decided it would be best to move back to West Virginia, where weather conditions were more suitable for their son’s health issues.

Upon moving back, Scott enrolled in the West Virginia School of Preaching. After graduation, he worked with the Bridge Street church of Christ in New Martinsville, WV, from 2001-2007. He then preached for the Front Royal, VA church of Christ. Finding a need to supplement his income, Scott enrolled in respiratory therapy school. For some time, he worked as a respiratory therapist for his living. Just recently, he had started preaching full-time again with the church in Charles Town, WV.

Emanuel Daugherty was the school’s director when Scott attended. He attested that Scott was one of the finest graduates the school had

ever produced.

Indeed, Scott was an excellent student of the word. I had asked him to substitute in the Revelation class last spring, and he jumped at the opportunity. He came that day prepared with voluminous notes. While I did not sit in on his class, he spoke in chapel that day, with a marvelous lesson from that apocalyptic book.

Scott was a man of many talents. He played music and loved scuba diving. He enjoyed hiking, backpacking, and motorcycling. He was one who was given to physical fitness, and had just achieved level 2 certification in Commando Krav Maga, a tactical self-defense course. That is quite an accomplishment for anyone, but especially someone at fifty-eight years of age. On a podcast not long before he passed, Scott spoke a little about how preachers need to exercise self-discipline in their own lives lest people not listen to them when they preach on such subjects. It reminded me of Paul in 1 Corinthians 9:27: “But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified.”

Scott was to speak on our lectureship this coming October. He had already completed his manuscript, which will be in the lectureship book.

Scott was an inspiration of positivity to those around him. He loved his family and would do anything for them. It has been observed that every career choice Scott made was service-oriented. He served his community with the police, the sick with respiratory therapy, and the souls of men in his work as a gospel preacher.

With his precious family, we mourn and grieve his loss.
