## The Preacher and His Family

Editor's Note: Originally a chapel talk, David kindly adapted this for inclusion in our newsletter. His advice, aimed at preachers, we believe to be profitable for the brotherhood to see.

We have a minister crisis. Correction, we have minister crises (plural)! I hear we are losing more preachers than are being prepared to replace them. I do not know what the replacement rate is, but I am not speaking about replacement numbers. That is not the crisis of which I am speaking. I want to focus on threats to a preacher and his family.

A Google Search on preachers (or pastors) and infidelity will reveal there is a serious problem. If you think that's "them" and not "us," then you would be mistaken. Many know of families shattered because the father, who was the preacher, committed adultery. We may be lured in a false sense of security when we proclaim "Not me! I would never!"

Joshua stated, "And if it seems evil to you to serve the Lord, choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15 NKJV). Notice Joshua's commitment was not just personal but also familial. We know Joshua's name was Hoshea and he was the son of Nun. He was a descendant of Joseph. His tribal lineage came through Ephraim (1 Chron 7:20, 23-27). Legend states Joshua was married and had daughters, but that is legend not Scripture. Have you ever noticed how many perfect families there were in the Bible? Even the Lord's family had problems. This informs me that it would be unwise to assume all will go well because you are a preacher and have a Christian family. Do not be taken in by a false sense of security. Fight for your family! Protect your family! Protect yourself!

#### A few points:

- Be sure not to assume that a church that is good for you is good for your family.
- Be sure to check on the welfare of your children when you move into a new area. Remember, it may be the "honeymoon period" for you, but it

- might be a real nightmare for your kids trying to make the adjustment.
- Be sure to make it clear to the church that you and your wife are responsible for the disciplining of your family.
- Be sure to encourage your children to be involved in worship and ministry to their full potential. Do not isolate them from the church.
- Be sure to be the spiritual leader of your family, not just in the church. Children need parents, not a buddy! Remember, what you place in your children's hands matter! Keep your hands holy!
- Do what is right not because others may be watching but because it is the right thing to do!
- Be sure to share the joys and laughter of ministry with your family, but be careful to shield them from negativity and criticism. My parents would say "Little ears are listening" to change the subject when us kids were around.
- Be sure your family knows "The church is a perfect institution made up of imperfect people."

  One of my children told me "The worst kind of criticism that I was exposed to while growing up was listening to members openly criticize my father." How you react to criticism in front of your children matters.
- Never be in a room alone with another woman unless it is your wife. People mocked Vice President Mike Pence for stating he made it a point to never dine with a woman alone other than his wife. The media mocked him, and a lawyer even tried to claim such a rule was not honorable but probably illegal, being another form of sexual harassment. Mike & Karen Pence were married August 4, 1978, and they are still married. Think about that!

Remember, the church can replace you, but your family cannot!

Paul instructed Timothy: "Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (1 Tim 4:12). It would be major mistake to assume that Timothy only had to pay attention to this because of his "youth." Keep yourself pure! Keep your family pure! Keep the church pure! Do not fail in any of these three areas! (Self, Family, Church).
